### **NOTIFICATION OF WORKS TO THE BRUNELL SEAWALL AT DAWLISH FROM AUGUST 2015 TO FEBRUARY 2015**

There being no Harbour Authority at Dawlish in Devon, Network Rail have been directed by the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) to issue the following Local Notice to Mariners.

Works will commence on the Brunel seawall at Dawlish on Monday, 25 August 2014 to increase its resilience between Coastguards Ramp and Rockstone Bridge. The works are currently planned to last until the end of February 2015 but this end date will be dependent upon the weather experienced during the period of the planned works.

Construction activities will primarily take place from two jack up barges positioned in front of the sea wall and over the beach abutting the seawall, moving along the seawall as progress is made.

The first jack up barge is planned to take up station on 3 September 2014 and will be serviced by vessels from Teignmouth harbour.

The barges will be jacked up on the beach abutting the Brunel seawall and will be fully lit with working lights clearly illuminating the barges 24hrs per day. Additional task lighting will illuminate the sea wall, in the works area.

An exclusion zone will be identified by yellow zone marking buoys, visible during the daytime, which will be placed in a line 400m long and parallel to and 200m from the Brunel seawall between Coastguards Ramp and Rockstone Bridge at Dawlish; vessels not involved in these works are advised to keep outside the exclusion zone.
